THE HEIDELBERG CATECHISM

LORD'S DAY 18

Q. What do you confess when you say, he ascended into heaven?

A. That Christ, before the eyes of his disciples, was taken up from the earth into heaven,¹ and that he is there for our benefit² until he comes again to judge the living and the dead.³

Q. Is Christ, then, not with us until the end of the world, as he has promised us?¹

A. Christ is true man and true God. With respect to his human nature he is no longer on earth,² but with respect to his divinity, majesty, grace, and Spirit he is never absent from us.³

Q. But are the two natures in Christ not separated from each other if his human nature is not present wherever his divinity is?

A. Not at all, for his divinity has no limits and is present everywhere.¹ So it must follow that his divinity is indeed beyond the human nature which he has taken on and nevertheless is within this human nature and remains personally united with it.²

Q. How does Christ's ascension into heaven benefit us?

A. First, he is our Advocate in heaven before his Father.¹ Second, we have our flesh in heaven as a sure pledge that he, our Head, will also take us, his members, up to himself.² Third, he sends us his Spirit as a counter-pledge,³ by whose power we seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God, and not the things that are on earth.⁴

Seeking a Music Director

We are looking for a person to lead the congregation in worship through music.

- Commit to support the mission, vision, and worship philosophy of Mansfield 1st EPC.
- Serve as accompanist, vocalist, or conductor as needed in all worship services.
- Mastery of piano is required; experience with organ and handbells is strongly desired.
- Choose, prepare, and perform special music for the weekly 10 a.m. worship service and any other special services as needed. The church facility is available for practice.
- Select songs for preludes, postludes, offertory, and communion and assist the pastor with hymn selections for weekly worship.
- Plan and provide music/lesson for preschool twice a week (approx. 2 hrs.)
- Coordinate substitute musicians during planned absences.
- Assist in developing a small handbell choir.
- Assist in developing a small group vocal ensemble and/or choir.
- Treat Sunday as the priority day of ministry for Mansfield 1st EPC
- Meet with the pastor at least one time a month for planning, communication, and evaluation.
- Attending the weekly church staff meetings at noon on Wednesdays is preferred.
- Part-time: 15-20 hours weekly, including 3 hours approx. on Sunday mornings
- Paid time off (4 Sundays per calendar year)
- Agree to the Personnel Policy and Seven Essentials of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church

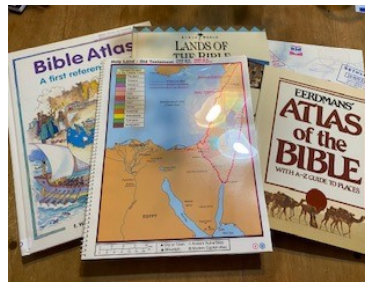
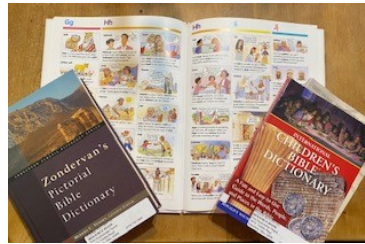
