

HEIDELBERG CATECHISM

LORD'S DAY 29

Q. Are then the bread and wine changed into the real body and blood of Christ?

A. No. Just as the water of baptism is not changed into the blood of Christ and is not the washing away of sins itself but is simply God's sign and pledge,1 so also the bread in the Lord's supper does not become the body of Christ itself,2 although it is called Christ's body3 in keeping with the nature and usage of sacraments.4

Q. Why then does Christ call the bread his body and the cup his blood, or the new covenant in his blood, and why does Paul speak of a participation in the body and blood of Christ?

A. Christ speaks in this way for a

good reason: He wants to teach us by his supper that as bread and wine sustain us in this temporal life, so his crucified body and shed blood are true food and drink for our souls to eternal life.1 But, even more important, he wants to assure us by this visible sign and pledge, first, that through the working of the Holy Spirit we share in his true body and blood as surely as we receive with our mouth these holy signs in remembrance of him,2 and, second, that all his suffering and obedience are as certainly ours as if we personally had suffered and paid for our sins.3

ONE COUPLE'S STORY

Jason Morse went to Alaska to please his wife and returned home with new life in Jesus Christ. Staff Sergeant Jason Morse

planned to lay low during the military marriage retreat in Alaska that his wife, Biby, had signed them up for. He'd have time to fish and it would make her happy that he'd joined her. "I'm just going to fake my way through it," he told her on their flight to the Samaritan's Purse wilderness lodge. "I'm just there for you and the fishing." Biby, though, still had hope. She'd found Operation Heal Our Patriots in a PTSD Facebook group for veterans' wives. She'd been praying for him for many years ."I just knew we needed to be there. We were drifting," she said. "We were losing each other." Jason doesn't talk much about his three difficult deployments to Afghanistan, but knows he's a different person since. He flips out sometimes. He isolates himself. He's tried taking his own life. Biby's been there for the worst of it. Surprised by God Despite his original plans, Jason's mind and heart were quickly stirred in Alaska. In Biblically based marriage classes, he learned how to hear and understand his wife—how to forgive and be forgiven. He found that other couples had similar "crazy" lives because of combat injuries. Then one night, he and Biby talked late into the night, asking one of our chaplains questions. "He walked us through Scripture and it finally made sense," Jason said. At the end of that conversation, he prayed to receive Jesus Christ as His Lord and Savior. On Friday morning the Morses recommitted their marriage to God. Jason was baptized by our chaplains in Lake Cark. This place is special. I'm so glad she signed us up," he said. "This place was a real eye-opener to me. I have a lot more to learn. One day at a time." Biby agreed: "This has been the most beautiful experience I've had.
