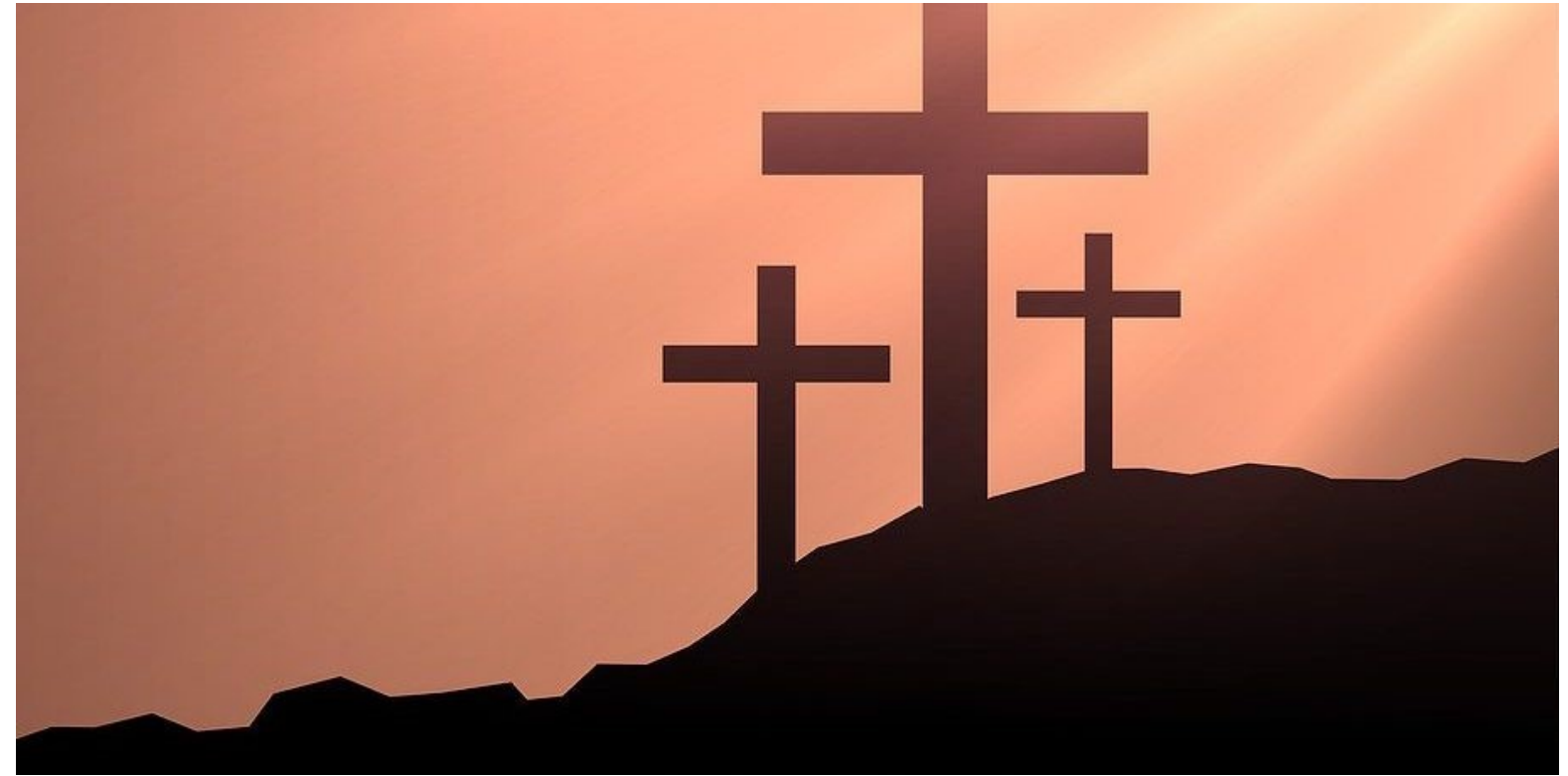

The Prayer of Great Thanksgiving (Responsive):

LEADER: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And also with you.

LEADER: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them to the Lord.

LEADER: Let us give thanks to the LORD, our God.

ALL: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

LEADER: Blessed are you, strong and faithful God. All Your works, the height and the depth, echo the silent music of Your praise. In the beginning Your Word summoned light, night withdrew, and creation dawned. The waters were gathered upon on the face of the earth and life appeared. When the earth had grown full in abundance, You created in Your image man and woman, the stewards of all creation. You gave us breath and speech, that all the living might find a voice to sing Your praise, and to celebrate the creation You call good.
